



Why are we going to Disney?

Live!

- **Expert speaker presentations** - through real life experiences our speakers will give students the chance to hear how mathematics can be used to develop models of real situations and learn that they can be more or less effective depending on the assumptions that have been made.
- **Q&A session** - interactive question and answer sessions will develop their knowledge and understanding of mathematical methods and concepts.
- **Team park challenges** - enable students to select and apply mathematical techniques to solve problems and interpret mathematical information to reach conclusions within a unique learning environment.

Travel - Passport

- **Passports need to be valid (preferably until at least October 2026)**
- **European Entry and Exit System (EES)**



What is it?

EES is a new electronic system used by the European Union to register travellers from non-EU countries. It will record personal data, biometric data (fingerprints and facial images), and entry/exit dates for all non-EU visitors.

How does it work?

At border points, travellers will go through kiosks that scan their passport, take a facial image, and record fingerprints. The system will help streamline and secure border control.

When does it start?

EES is expected to become operational in October 2025, with full operation expected from April 2026.



- **Reminder: Talk to us and be proactive.**

Money

- **Students should be prepared to make payments in the UK and France.**
- **The suggested, minimum, amount is €30 + £20**
- **This is for food during travel days, souvenirs or ‘shopping money’.**
- **Please be aware that the students will be responsible for their own money.**
- **Our students should be capable of keeping their money safe and spending it wisely.**

Trips Policies

- The academies have policies designed to cover most eventualities.
- The staff involved in residential trips are made aware of their roles and responsibilities.
- The primary role of staff is to keep all of the students safe.

Acts of Terror / Natural Disaster

- The Trip Leader will take the group back to their hotel as quickly as possible (using secure forms of transportation).
- Once in the hotel the group will go into 'lockdown'; the students are not allowed to leave their rooms without permission from the teachers.
- The Trip Leader will consult with Mr. Lima and the British Embassy to decide the safest course of action; usually, that is to stay where they are.
- Parents will be contacted by the school. Do not try to contact the Trip Leader; we need to keep that line of communication open.
