### Safeguarding

The Academies take the safety, security and happiness of all students very seriously and believes every child has a right to a happy, successful and enjoyable education. ### **Required Uniform**

#### Skirt

Glenmoor students can wear a tartan skirt, or charcoal trousers. Skirts must not be shortened or rolled.



#### Trousers

Trousers can be purchased from Price & Buckland, or if purchased elsewhere must be in charcoal (not black or pale grey).





Socks and tights must be plain black. There should be no visible logos or patterns. Please remember to label all items of clothing, shoes, bags, water bottles and any other items brought into school.




#### Shirt



Glenmoor students require a 'Revere' style shirt. Winton students require a closed-neck shirt, as they wear a tie. Short or long sleeve is acceptable.



Students are expected to wear the Academy blazer during the day. During hot weather, we will advise parents if a blazer is required.





#### Shoes



Shoes must be in a black formal polished leather or leather-look style. We do not accept trainers, canvas shoes, heels or platforms, or other casual shoes.

















A medical note supplied by a doctor or medical practitioner must be provided to wear non-uniform footwear.

A unisex jumper is available for students which can be worn under the blazer, this is an optional item but if worn, must be purchased from Price & Buckland.

### PE Kit

Black, navy blue or white base layers are permitted for outdoor lessons. Bright coloured base layers are prohibited.



Glenmoor students can wear plain black leggings, unisex Academy shorts, or the Academy skort. Winton students must wear the Academy PE shorts.




Students must wear the unisex academy polo top, or a 'girl's fit' academy polo top is also available.

## Fin

#### Headscarves

Plain headscarves may be worn, in black or navy.

No nail-varnish, nail extensions or hand decorations are permitted. Year 10-11 students are permitted to wear natural make-up which is restricted to minimal mascara and concealer. No fake tan is permitted.

#### Hair Style

Hair must be a natural colour. Skin fades, patterns, or undercuts are not permitted, or eyebrow lines. Hair styles should not be extreme. Head band, if worn, should be either navy blue or black.







#### Piercings & Jewellery

One plain gold/silver stud earring may be worn in each ear; these must be removed or covered for all forms of physical education. Jewellery (rings, necklaces etc) is not permitted.





### No Handbags until Year 10. Students should wear a plain backpack or sturdy messenger bag.

KS4 handbags should be plain black leather, or leather- look.



When students are in the buildings they are expected to wear full uniform to a high standard of presentation. Our expectations of students as they move around the site during the academy day include:

- Blazer on
- · Blazer sleeves rolled down
- · Blouse/shirt tucked in
- Tie on (Winton)
- House badge on blazer lapel

Refusal to comply with uniform standards will result in a reflection being sanctioned until the issue is resolved.

## Mobile Phones & Devices

At our Academies, we want every student to feel focused, safe, and ready to achieve their best. To help make this possible, we have a clear approach to mobile phones and electronic devices:

- During the academy day (8am 4pm), all phones and electronic devices (such as smart watches) must be switched off. This helps reduce distractions, ensures lessons run smoothly, and supports positive face-to-face interaction.
- Students may bring their phones to school, but they remain the student's responsibility at all times and **must be kept in their bags**.
- To keep our community safe and respectful, phones and devices (including media players and headphones) must not be used anywhere on site.
- If a phone is seen during the day, it will be confiscated. We will let parents/carers know if this happens.
- Confiscated phones will lead to a same-day detention so that we can reinforce the importance of the policy quickly and fairly.
- Refusal to hand in a phone when asked is considered very serious, and will lead to a fixed-term exclusion until parents/carers have met with staff.

We know mobile phones are an important part of life outside school, but during the academy day we want to make sure every student has the best chance to learn, concentrate, and enjoy positive relationships with friends and staff. Thank you for supporting us in helping all students get the most out of their education.

### Lockers

#### https://locker.rentals/

Lockers at the academies are located in year group blocks. Once these are sold then parents are free to choose a locker outside of these blocks. Lockers can only be rented for the duration of an academic year, at the end of which all personal items need to be removed. A new locker, in a different location, will need to be rented each year. The same locker cannot be held for the entire duration a student is at the academies.

Availability of lockers is allocated on a first come, first served basis. Please ensure that you enter the correct year group your child will be in September 2025 and select the correct academic year. Any bookings for the incorrect academic year will not be valid and you may still be charged.

We believe that providing our students with a broad, balanced curriculum should be at the heart of everything we do. Our curriculum exploits links between the skills and content in different subjects to enable our students to experience coherence in their learning.

#### **Academic Support**

Students who arrive at the Academies having not achieved the benchmark standard in maths and English (literacy) will be given additional support to boost their progress in their first year of secondary education and beyond.

This support takes the form of additional literacy and numeracy lessons, most of which will take place during the academy day, although students may be asked to attend sessions before or after school. Parents and carers will be fully consulted with if we feel your child would benefit from this intervention.

### **Grammar Stream**

The aims of the Grammar Stream are twofold:

- Develop the 'academic breadth and ability' of students beyond the normal provision of most secondary schools.
- Encourage the holistic growth of those individuals to help them succeed in whatever they choose to pursue in the future.
- It is hoped that this will have several benefits:
- Entry to top universities
- Career development and adaptability

#### What is the Grammar Stream?

The Grammar Stream consists of some of highest attaining students in Years 7-9. They commit to participate in certain 'academic' and 'non-scholastic' strands. The Grammar Stream runs academically parallel with Set 1. Grammar Stream students take part in various bespoke activities including team building, a reading programme, public speaking, a lecture programme and external trips. The aim is to develop their all-round character, as epitomised in the Grammar Stream motto 'Engage, Contribute, and Lead'.

#### **Entry and retention from Sep 2024**

All Year 7 students are invited to register their interest in the Grammar Stream through a written application. These applications are then considered alongside other evidence such as baseline assessments which are completed in the Autumn term. Membership of the Grammar Steam is intended to last for three years as long as the students:

- Participate fully in the Grammar Stream offer.
- Maintain high standards in academic progress, behaviour, conduct.

Membership of the Grammar Steam pre-September 2024

The retention of students in the Grammar Stream who joined before Sep 2024 is based upon the following:

- Having an overall rank above 60th
- Full participation in the academic and non-scholastic strands
- Maintaining an average attendance above 94%
- Maintaining high standards of behaviour, conduct and being a rolemodel for others.

### Canteen

The Academies' canteen is cashless. Purchases are paid for using an iPay account issued to students at the start of term. An iPay account reference link will be sent to parents which allows them to set up and control their child's iPay account whereby they can see the balance on the account and add money online as required. Students use their finger to access the funds in their account. The finger scan generates a unique code to access the iPayipay account and therefore no biometric data is stored on our systems.

Any funds left on the account at the end of the year will roll over to be used in the following year. Parents have full visibility of what their child has purchased each day, and it is also easy to upload money onto an account. The finger scan system stops students having to bring cash into school and is a safe way to pay as the finger scan is unique to each child.

#### **Free School Meals**

Parents and Carers of children entitled to Free School Meals will have an iPay account already set up for their child.

The daily FSM allowance is £2.65; if this is not spent it is **not** carried forward to the next day.

The FSM allowance can be used to purchase a meal deal.

#### Main Meal Deal:

- Hot main dish OR hot grab & go OR sandwich/wrap/pasta OR salad pot
- PLUS home bake/hot pudding/fruit pot OR bottle of water

At Glenmoor and Winton Academies we aim:

- 4.To ensure that SEND students take as full a part as possible in all Academy activities
- 5.To ensure that parents of SEND students are kept fully informed of their child's progress and attainment
- 6.To ensure that students with SEND and their parents/carers are involved in discussions and decisions affecting SEND provision
- 7.To ensure that students with SEND are assisted during their transition into and out of the Academy
- 8.To operate a 'whole pupil, whole school' approach to the management and provision of support for special educational needs
- 9.In conjunction with the Medical Policy, make arrangements to support pupils with medical conditions and to have regard to statutory guidance supporting pupils with medical conditions

Support can be provided in class through quality first teaching strategies, in small groups or working 1:1 in the Inclusion Department. If students are registered as having SEND, regular assessments are carried out to monitor progress and adjust the provision if necessary.

### **Attendance**
