
Why are we going to Washington?



Money

Trips Policies

- The academies have policies designed to cover most eventualities.
- The staff involved in residential trips are made aware of their roles and responsibilities.
- The primary role of staff is to keep all of the students safe.

Acts of Terror / Natural Disaster

- The Trip Leader will take the group back to their hotel as quickly as possible (using secure forms of transportation).
- Once in the hotel the group will go into 'lockdown'; the students are not allowed to leave their rooms without permission from the teachers.
- The Trip Leader will consult with Mr. Lima and the British Embassy to decide the safest course of action; usually, that is to stay where they are (and not to rush to an airport / train station as these are often used as secondary targets).
- Parents will be contacted by the school. Do not try to contact the Trip Leader; we need to keep that line of communication open.
